Assistant/Associate Professor of Speech-Language Pathology

APPOINTMENT: Assistant/Associate Professor of Speech-Language Pathology. Tenure eligible position – regular 9-month academic year with summer teaching possible. Responsibilities include teaching undergraduate and graduate courses and some clinical supervision. Expertise in any area within the field of Communication Disorders will be considered. Starting date is August, 2009 or negotiable. Collaborative research with colleagues and students is especially encouraged. Must have good communication skills and an interest in working closely with others within the university community.

QUALIFICATIONS: Candidates must possess the ASHA CCC-SLP and strong communication skills. A Ph.D. in Speech-Language Pathology is preferred, but the ABD will be considered. Must be eligible for Missouri license in Speech-Language Pathology. Previous teaching and clinical experience is desirable. Evidence of research interests and abilities, and supervisory experience are preferred.

SALARY & RANK: Competitive and commensurate with qualifications and experience. Truman offers an attractive benefits package including life, health, and disability insurance, retirement contributions, and assistance with relocation expenses.
